Meeting Minutes July 25, 2024

1. Call to Order

Police Chiefs President Scott Engle called the Joint Pierce County Fire and Police Chiefs Associations meeting to order at 11:30 a.m. at Farm 12 located at 3303 8th Ave SE, Puyallup, WA. According to the headcount during the meeting there were a total of 36 people in attendance. Self-introductions were made.

2. Speaker: Phoebe Mulligan on Leadership and Self-Care

3. Child Abuse Protocols Overview for Police and Fire

Bryce Nelson and Lindsay Finney from the PC Prosecutors Office reported the Child Abuse Protocols have been updated. They are renewed every two years. Collaborate and share information. The explained identifying the disciplines roles and responsibilities and when services are needed. The protocols apply to children ages 3 to 15 years old. Sometimes 16- and 17-year-old age range as well. The information gathered is critical for prosecuting cases. Identifying how to work together for the best outcome of the children involved. They can come out and provide training to fire departments for crews to better understand the protocols. Law Enforcement is already pretty aware of the process. They've not done as good a job on the fire service side for awareness training.

4. <u>Overview of Gig Harbor Fire and Central Pierce Fire's use of LTE technology for</u> <u>enhanced radio coverage</u>

Fire Chiefs President Jim Sharp stated he appreciates being here as it's been a while since we've had a joint meeting. Radio coverage is a critical piece of what we all do and there is new/different technology available in the radio environment (LTE) to expand what we currently have in place. Chiefs Dennis Doan (Gig Harbor) and Dustin Morrow (Central Pierce) are here to share more information on this topic.

Chief Doan stated he brought their consultants with to share a presentation as well on the work they have been doing on connectivity. It is not a 3rd radio system being done, but just enhancing what is already there. Looking at options to overcome the connectivity issues. Ben Ealey reported the engineers looked at the data collected on the cell phone carriers signals, etc. See attached copy of the powerpoint presentation.

Chief Doan stated they are looking into expanding the LMR (Land Mobile Radio) system through digital, wireless and satellite (LTE) systems. The tower on Fox Island will have 800 on it as well as add on LTE capabilities. Chief Odenburg reported they are also

working with the school district. Gig Harbor to own the equipment and power poles, etc. Broaden the ability to look across jurisdiction and working with multi-agencies.

Chief Morrow reported Central Pierce has a new radio that is cellular enabled, tri-band with LTE that he is able to hear CPFR rigs from Key Peninsula without any issues. Chief VanKeulen has been looking into advancing technology. He thanked Chiefs Doan and Morrow for being courageous on this issue. To mitigate danger it is a moral imperative to solve the connection and communication issue. We need to have the ability to communicate. Chief Morrow shared how it not only benefits us in the public sector but also our citizens benefit from this as well.

What's Been Going Well


- Peer Support Programs

Leadership Challenges


- Leaders hold much of the responsibility for how things turn out, the inability to share the inner workings of decisions, and often get minimal credit for any positive outcomes.
- It can be lonely at the top.
- There is the potential of feeling betrayed by people that you hired, trained and for whose well-being you look to protect.
- Leaders typically no longer get to be in a role that first attracted you to this career.

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Bonus: it works with everyone, everywhere, all the time

Validation and Why it Matters

- Validation: treating another person's emotion or experience as real.
- It is not fixing, lecturing, problem solving or shaming.
- Why do we need people to validate the way we feel?
 - Social creatures; look to others to determine accuracy of experience
 - We read other people constantly



"You Shouldn't Feel That Way"

- What happens when we tell people that their emotional experience is not real?
 - Double down on emotional expression to prove that it is real
 - Power differential dynamic
- The goal of these interactions is to increase the connection between two people. Not feeling understood is the opposite of that goal.
- Validation is the way that we communicate the understanding of emotion, build connection and SIMULTANEOUSLY helps the emotion itself decrease in intensity.

Being awake, alert and interested

• Giving our full attention

Make sounds and non-verbals

- Reinforces the other person to continue to talk with us
- Ex. talking on the phone

Naming the emotion

- One word: "You feel like that is unfair to you because..." vs. "You seem really angry"
- Can acknowledge the emotion without agreeing with it

Level 1 validation skills

Validation by context

• Anyone in a similar situation would feel the same way

Validation by reference to self

- I have felt that way or I would feel that way in a similar situation (has to be true)
- Provide just enough information for understanding; not an invitation to discuss your own stuff

Validation by history

• Given that person's history, their (potentially excessive) response makes sense

Level 2 validation skills

Validation using accurate reflection

- Not a direct re-statement of someone's words
- "Something happened and you're really upset about it"

Validation using radical genuineness

• The emotion they are exhibiting is so powerful that you begin to experience it yourself (must be true, helpful, and less than)

Functional validation

• Treating an emotion as SO real that you take functional steps to soothe it (sit next to them, hand on the shoulder)




What happens next?

- People are not looking for problem-solving; they are looking for connection and understanding. When they believe they have been heard the door opens to accepting help
 - Ex. OT experience
- Once the emotion has decreased and it is clear that the person feels understood, we can ask the question:

"Would you like help figuring out what to do?"



Lack of Coverage/Connectivity




Connectivity at Fire Stations




North Gig Harbor Coverage

Legend of Coverage


Gig Harbor West






Gig Harbor East






The Fox Island


